


HERITAGE ROLLING STOCK GRAFFITIED



On the morning of the 23rd May 2008, on arrival at the stabling point of the TRM railmotors in Thirroul yard and to the utter dismay of the train crew, the stabled motors were found to have been "vandalised" during the night by persons unknown. A concerted effort by the train crew to start the tedious process to clean the exterior paintwork was made prior to their departure from Thirroul for the 10 day South West tour by the T.R.I.P.S (Thirroul Railway Institute Preservation Society Inc.) group. The motors were progressively cleaned when time permitted as the tour headed south and was complete by the time the train arrived at Griffith on Sunday 25th May. The train crew are to be commended for the sterling effort put in to remove the offending graffiti from the motors. More photos of this "attack" are featured in this edition of the newsletter.

INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT MAY/JUNE 2008

The Culvert on the walkway down to the depot shed has been replaced by a bridge thanks to the Infrastructure group and to the donation of one of our workers of the checker plate for the decking. The Infrastructure group is gradually restoring the track work that was damaged by the recent downpour (25 ml in 1¹/₂ hours) and the lifting and levelling of the arrival road. A thank you must go to some outside help given by some non members in achieving these tasks. (Infrastructure Manager)

With this recent wet weather, the depot has had very little damage. During the past few weeks work has steadily been done to restore the depot in regards to filling the exposed drain at the Dungog end. The three 300mm pipes that were removed from the walkway were used in the drain on the Dungog end. This work has been slow but we are gradually getting on top of it, with fill to cover these pipes being donated by our neighbour wanting to get rid of an unwanted driveway. This has saved us from obtaining fill from outside sources.

We have acquired sufficient sleepers so work can start on re sleepering the shunting neck in the near future and this will finish the perway work required at the Dungog end. In the near future work will be done on the culvert increasing the pipe size to 900mm and extending the pipe work towards the shed from an a 1200 x 1200 pit. On completion of this, it will allow us to commence 4 road points, (these points have been obtained and are awaiting installation).

For the next few weeks I will be away but the Infrastructure group will still work to achieve the success and achievements that has been done in the last 2 years with new work going on all the time.

ENGINEERING REPORT MAY/JUNE 2008

1: HPC 402—A new communications system has been installed, fitted and tested to this rail motor on loan for the up and coming jobs that the society has acquired. Also all the necessary communications for the Epping-Chatswood tunnel link test has been carried out by the contractor. The toilet in one end has been removed with the sink and basin being retained.

2: CPH 1 & 7 serviced and ready for the upcoming tours.

3: CPH 3 transmission has been sent to Maitland Diesel Service for warranty repairs. Painting inside continues with the 2nd coat being applied.

4: A 3rd steel bin has arrived and this will be filled with surplus scrap material of no use to the society.

5: Before the running of the annual Maitland Steamfest, a trial run for the CPH rail motors to Dungog and return was carried out with no problems arising after major bogie overhauls.

6: I would like to report our "first" failure in 20 years I have been with the Society. ie. HPC402 would not start on the night when it was to leave for the Epping-Chatswood radio test train # batteries were found dead and 4 new batteries were purchased at a cost of \$1000.00. The Rail Motor is ready again for work. The workshop fitters will be fitting Trickle chargers to the rail motor for connection to shed supply when in depot.

7: Our CPH Rail Motors have travelled a huge amount of Kilometres over the past fortnight on 2 separate trips, South & North West, performed once again, as good as ever.


8: CPH3 is progressing quite well with the Dungog end of the Rail Motor painting inside now complete, the other end will start soon.




